### Maths

#### Mental Maths:

I will continue with some Mental Maths activities from the *Brain Teasers* book which I will upload onto Seesaw. This week we will do some revision tests from test 69-71 and 89-92. They can be found [here](#). Last week's answers can be found [here](#).

#### *Chapter 36 3D Shapes*

To start with I have made a [short revision page on the shapes](#) you should know and some names of shapes you might need to revise. You can refer to it when doing this chapter.

Try the following questions: p151 q1 (b), p152 q2 q3, p153 q1 (Activities to draw and cut), p154 q2.

#### *Chapter 37 Data (Averages)*

This should be familiar to you as we often do them as part of Mental Maths.

*To find the average you add the items together and divide by the number of items you have.*

Try p155 q1,2,3,4. p156 q1 and 5,  
p157 q1,2,4 (all) *Read the coloured box carefully before starting*  
p158 q2.

#### *Chapter 38 Capacity.*

*Remember 1000 ml= 1 Litre. The new item to look at is calculating the volume which is on page 161. It is calculated by Length x Width x Height. The measurement is written in  $m^3$  or  $cm^3$ .*

Try p160 q2,4,6. p161 q1 p162 q2

Practising these sums will give you a good overview over the main points to know. The answers for these chapters will be posted with next week's work.
