
Each pod in fifth class made a poster to mark Mrs Behan's retirement.

We also made Christmas cards to send to Borris Lodge nursing home.






And, after reading "Under the Hawthorn Tree" we made our own famine village,

Mrs B: I became Principal in 2014, when Mr O'Gorman retired. Six years.


A: What three things are you looking forward to doing when you retire?

A: What three things are you most proud of about the school?


Mrs B: That children seem happy, confident and glad to be part of our school family, that the school looks well, is in a beautiful setting, and that it has good facilities.
